Workshop Implementation

INAUGURATION OF ONE DAY CONSULTATIVE WORKSHOP

Time : 10:00 A.M. to 1:30 P.M.

Prof. S.N. Shukla *Pro Vice-Chancellor*, **Dr. Rammanohar Lohiya Avadh University, Ayodhya (UP)** inaugurated the one-day consultative workshop on "**Nai Talim, Experiential Learning and Work Education in School & Teacher Education Curriculum**" by lighting the lamp in front of holy photographs of Saraswati, Mahatma Gandhi & Late Babu K.N. Singh, founder of Kamla Nehru Institute of Physical & Social Sciences, Sultanpur (UP). Saraswati Vandana was performed by B.Ed. & D.El.Ed Pupil Teachers.

The following are the highlighted events of the program.

INAUGURAL ADDRESS

In his inaugural address, **Prof. S.N. Shukla**, *Pro Vice-Chancellor*, **Dr. Rammanohar Lohiya Avadh University, Ayodhya (UP)** said that after independence our academic and political thinkers have performed many experiments but unfortunately many of them have failed because all experiments were away from our natural needs and necessities based education. Further, he said that American Universities make Experiment on Newton's Theory and Find out that Newton's Theory is based on Indian Vedas. Therefore, they are very much interested in study and investigating scientific facts from Indian Vedas, but we are slowly going away from our spiritual and cultural heritage.

Mahatma Gandhi has been thinking and working out from the very beginning through Educational thought. Gandhi Ji felt that Education based on English culture is not suitable for us and our circumstances. Therefore, he proposed Basic Education or Fundamental Education which is also known as Nai Talim. With this Educational thought his idea was to emphasize that our Education should be given to our children by Basic Craft. In this way Prof. Shukla emphasized that Gandhian thought regarding Education is very useful in the present Indian context. But situation is Vice-Versa. So it is a subject of our discussion that how Gandhian thought can be implemented in present Educational Curriculum.

Dr. Anil Kumar Dubey, *Sr. Faculty, MGNCRE*, presented a briefing about the Workshop. He said that on the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti, on every 2nd October, political and academic thinkers feel that qualitative inadequacy is prevalent in our Education system. So now a very relevant question before us that how we can connect our learners (students) with experiential and experimental works based learning?

Dr. V.P. Singh, *Sr. Faculty, MGNCRE* explained the aims and objectives of this Consultative Workshop on "**Nai Talim, Experiential Learning and Work Education in School & Teacher Education Curriculum**". There are three things important in this Nai Talim –

- Experiential Learning
- Development of 3 H
- Community Engagement

In experiential learning, Learning should be based on activity. In 3H (Hand, Heart

and Head)we must first perform an activity (Hand) which creates experience (Heart) and this experience ultimately is converted in to knowledge (Head). Therefore it could be a matter of our discussion that how we can include above Gandhian thought in our teaching learning practices. In this Workshop, we shall work out that how we can include NaiTalim in our School as well as Teacher Education Curriculum.

Prof.Yashwant Singh, Ex. Principal, KNIPSS, Sultanpur (UP)emphasised that Gandhian thought related with NaiTalim is relevant today as it was in the past. Prof. Singh further said that Gandhiji's put in efforts to bring social equality due to education. So he emphasized that education should be based on a basic craftas it plays two sided role. On the one side learner will become skilled in particular craft and other side he will be self-employed.

Prof. Singh also explained thatNaiTalim in the light of Indian constitution and legal provisions. He explained section 21A Right to Free and Compulsory Education Act 2009. Gandhiji seeks to connect education to village and with their ground reality to the learner. Therefore, present workshop provides a stimulus for interaction between the academic experts that how NaiTalim could be an integrated part of our school and teacher education curriculum.

Dr. Anil Kumar Srivastava Principal, KNIPSS, Sultanpur, expressed his greeting and proposd the vote of thanks towards chief guest Prof. S.N. Shukla or his gracious presence in the present workshop. He also extended his gratitude to Dr. Anil Kumar Dubey, Dr. V.P. Singh Sr. Faculty MGNCRE , Prof. Angad Singh and Prof. N.K. Singh, Faculty of Education, Raja Harpal Singh P.G. College, Sigratau, Jaunpur for their contribution to successful organization of the present Workshop.

1st Technical Session

Therefore, NaiTalim is very useful and it must be discussed through the conferences and workshops and we must find out the concrete outlines to implement NaiTalim in our present school and teacher education curriculum.
