



Workshop Implementation:

A one day curriculum development workshop on 'Nai-Talim' Work Education and Community Engagement was organized by the State Council of Education Research and Training (SCERT) Gurugram, Haryana in collaboration with Mahatma Gandhi Council of Rural Education (MGNCRE), Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India (GOI) on 4th October 2018. The workshop started with the prayer and the lighting of lamp by Director, SCERT Dr. Jyoti Choudhary H.E.S. Smt Anshun Singla, Dy. Director and Smt. Suman Sharma Assistant Director SCERT also graced the inaugural function.

Sixty six participants from various DIETs and schools, representing all 23 districts of Haryana participated in the workshop. Dr. Ashwini Vashistha Dy. Director coordinated the workshop along with the undersigned.

Addressing the delegates Smt. Jyoti Choudhary, Director SCERT Haryana focused on the need of bringing back the old and valuable Indian system of integrated learning with full integration OF Head-Heart-and Hand in learning systems. She highlighted the lack of harmony in the society due to increasing differences and distances between rich and poor, educated and uneducated, urban and rural communities and people. She recollected Gandhi's saying that India lives in villages. We need social skills all inclusive development and Truth, Non-violence and equality in the society. This can be best inculcated in the young generation by adopting nai-talim as the system of education. He emphasized the urgent requirement of the education system reforms with nai-talim as the key component. At the end of his address Smt Choudhary committed full cooperation and support of the Haryana state and SCERT for the efforts of MGNCRE to mainstream Experiential Learning and Work-Education in the curriculum of classes 1-12 of JCERT. She indicated that Haryana is fully committed to include Experiential learning in the school curricula right from 2019-20 sessions. Two posters of Mahatma Gandhi Nai Talim Abhiyan were also released on this occasion.

Smt. Anshu Singla, Dy. Director, SCERT recollected her experiences at July 25-26, 2018 Workshop at NIMSME, Hyderabad and expressed her thanks to Chairman MGNCRE for a single minded mission to main-stream experiential learning in the curricula of B.Ed, D.Ed. D.El. Ed and L.T. to ensure its transaction pan-India at school- both primary and secondary, and college-B.Ed, D.Ed levels at the earliest.

Speaking on the occasion Mrs.Suman Sharma faculty, SCERT Gurugram requested delegates to watch latest film 'Sui-Dhaga' (currently in theatres) which has a very strong social message that all professions need equal respect, and we can earn our living by following our passion in art, sports, handicraft and cultural hobbies, along with perusing academic studies. Overall development of the child as a responsible social being is the key component of primary and secondary education.

Resource person, Dr. V. P. Sharma, Senior academic consultant, MGNCRE, Department of Higher Education, Govt. of India emphasized the need for integrating experiential learning in the curriculum of classes 1-5 on urgent basis. Dr. Sharma explained the nation-wide plan of MGNCRE to facilitate mainstreaming of Experiential learning in the curricula of D.Ed, D.El.Ed. B.Ed. along with the curricula for the schools at primary and secondary level. He underlined full support and cooperation from Ministry of Human Resources Development Government of India for this novel mission.

The vote of thanks for the inaugural session was presented by Dr. Ashwini Vashistha, Program Coordinator, SCERT Gurugram. In the first technical session, the participants were introduced to the concept of Curriculum Development on Nai-Talim, Work Education and community Engagement. In the Post lunch session four groups were formed where group one, two, three and four were asked to perform some activity on curriculum development on Nai-Talim, Work Education and Community Engagement from classes I-V, VI-VIII, IX-X and XI-XII respectively.

Group 1 emphasized that the curriculum for primary classes I-V should be relevant to the society which should be value based and skill based. The Education imparted should be such that it benefits the nature as well as impart economic values to the students. For example, if the students are taught about Agriculture, then first of all their knowledge regarding plants, nurseries, seeds, soil etc. is to be sharpened. Secondly they learn values like affection, good conducts, hard working and honesty. Moreover it leads to the aesthetic development of the child. The skills like panting, cutting, dwelling, ground making, grafting, use of tools and insects disinfectants are learned by the child.

Group 2 talked about the curriculum for the middle classes VI-VIII. In the initial months of their admission, the Gardner from the community will be invited to the schools while the students will also be accompanied to the parks community. The parents will also be invited to share their

knowledge. In I quarter the students would be taught to prepare ground, flower beds; planting seeds; flower cutting and watering. During 1st six months they will observe the plant growth patterns to protect the pants by fevering, using sheets for shade etc. In 1st year they will be attending plants while watering, dwelling, adding manures and protecting flower. Therefore, within three years they will have thorough knowledge of flowers; their types; cutting; preservation; raising sapling and moreover selling flowers and organic manure. So the productive values will be incorporated into students with the introduction of such curriculum.

Group 3 Proposed activities to be incorporated at higher education i.e. XI-XII standard for the students of government schools. They should be guided with the preservation of seasonal fruits and vegetable; waste management; organic farming; vertical gardening. The program for balanced diet should be incorporated. The charts should be prepared while counting calories and identifying malnutrition among the children. The subjects like meditation and Yoga should be introduced to reduce the stress among students. The vocational subjects like plumber work, electrical works, disaster management, defense activities, rainwater harvesting, first and knowledge should be introduced.

Group 4 proposed the curriculum for higher secondary classes XI-XII. They discussed regarding community living within and outside the school. They said that within the schools the curriculum should be actively based with the practical knowledge to students according to their interest and age. There should be counselling of students and parents and stress management activities should be practiced. Guest lecturers should be organized by the eminent scholars. Action research projects should be conducted with the help of teachers. The education should be skill based while sex education should be made the part of curriculum.

For community outside the school; the door to door campaigns should be organized to aware community regarding social issues. There should be wish to banks and rehabilitation centers. Awareness should be given to people of slum areas about personal hygiene while the students of 11th and 12th standards should teach poor children free of cost. Disaster management should be introduced to aware students about the environment issues.

In the Valedictory Session, Smt Jyoti Choudhary complemented the Workshop faculty for the successful organization of the workshop. She indicated that the time for implementing coreconcept of work-education and experiential learning has come, and we the Teacher-educators have a very critical role to play in this mission. Smt. Anshu Singla proposed vote of thanks. All

the delegates were awarded Certificate of participation in the Workshop. The Workshop concluded at 6.00 pm. SCERT Haryana also decided the dates for the Master Trainers' Development Program (MTDP) for 30-40 participants at SCERT Gurugram during October 22-26, 2018.
