

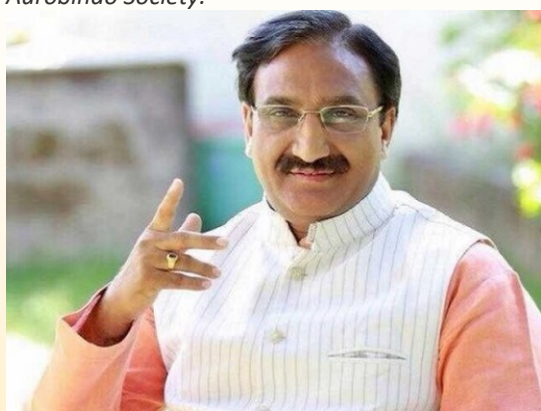

Our Project on Nai Talim – Gandhiji's Experiential Learning meets the criteria set by UNESCO Chair Programmes of enhancing the capacities of higher education and research institutions through an integrated system of research, training, information and documentation activities related to rural community engagement, work education and experiential learning in the teacher education and school education fields. School education in India needs to be oriented to make children knowledgeable, healthy and skillful. The principal idea of Nai Talim, as conceived by Mahatma Gandhi, is proper education of the body, mind and soul. The child needs to be taught and trained in life skills as well as livelihood options, along with logic, mathematics, science and languages. The initial seven years of child education needs to be in mother-tongue.

MGNCRE has been involved in promoting Gandhian values of village self-reliance through Faculty Empowerment and Development activities in Central and State universities for the last 23 years. MGNCRE intends to work wholly as a facilitating and hand-holding agency in line with requirements and as per mutually identified needs. This can happen only if unremitting efforts are made with the involvement of institutions like NCERT, SCERTs, DIETs, CABE, NCTE and University Departments of Education. With this, the teachers of higher educational institutions will educate the students according to the industry needs and equip them with varied kinds of skills.


29 बीएड महाविद्यालयों में शिक्षा मंत्रालय के वेबिनार का आयोजन

नयी शिक्षा नीति के तहत सभी कॉलेजों में होगा सेमिनार : प्रतिकुलपति



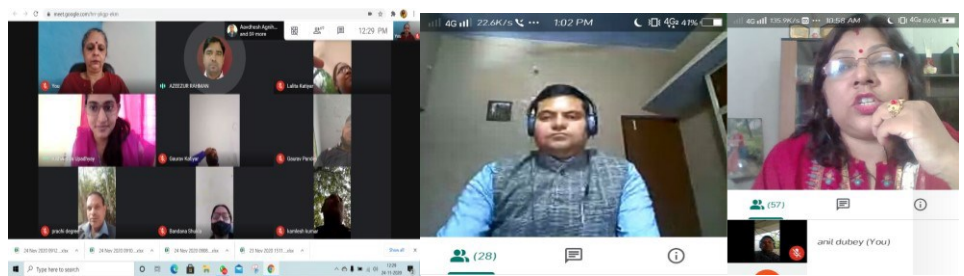
MGNCRE – SCERT Telangana collaboration for Online VENDEL Action Plan Workshops
