



Sikkim Pioneering Rural Management for Bachelor's and Master's Degree in Our Country: Honorable Education Minister of Sikkim Shri Kunga Nima Lepcha Launches Curriculum



"A truly innovative curriculum for the benefit of students" said Honorable Education Minister of Sikkim **Shri Kunga Nima Lepcha** as he launched the Rural Management Curriculum in Sikkim on 29th January organised at Sikkim HRDD Secretariat.

Sravan Kumar** called for handling house wastes in a better way. He said "The present generation should give the same kind of environment to the next generation. Climate change is the major problem. Quality of handling waste is also very important to the organizations and people who convert the waste into a useful one. Each family should think of converting vegetable wastes as manure".Dr.Elangovan Kariappan, Assistant Innovation Director, Innovation Cell, MHRD, New Delhi was the Guest of Honour and spoke about the usefulness of waste products especially granite dust and how it helped enhance the livelihood of women in rural areas. He also spoke about how 3D printers which range from 40,000 to 4 crores can be made from Computer and laptop waste. He said "Plenty of opportunities are available in wastes to start a start-up and for which Government is supporting. There are about 5500 Atel Tinkering Labs established in India in the schools under Atel Innovation Mission with a grant of 20 lacs to each school. Students from 6th standard to 12th standard are given opportunities to involve in innovation and creativity." Dr.M.Dwarakanath, Former Director/Member Secretary, DST, Puducherry shared that the ground waste generates dangerous gases like methane which is extremely harmful for the environment. The garbage should be disposed in 3 bins- degradable, biodegradable and medicinal purpose. This has been

implemented in many houses and apartments in Coimbatore and separate lorries have also been allotted for the same. He hoped this method would be applied all over the country.

The second day of the Industry-Academia Meet started in the luminous presence of **Thiru. S.P. Velumani, Hon'ble Minister of Municipal Administration Rural Development and Implementation of Special Programme, Government of Tamilnadu** and other dignitaries. **Dr. P. Baby Shakila, Principal, Sri Krishna Arts and Science College** welcomed the gathering and asked the students and stakeholders to attain a clean and healthy environment through efficient Waste Management. Hon'ble
