celebrations. Launch of 'Experiential learning- Gandhiji's NaiTalim' in all States/Union Territories.

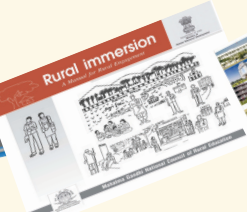
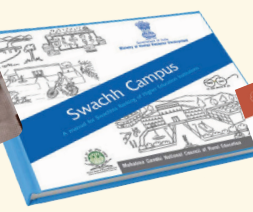
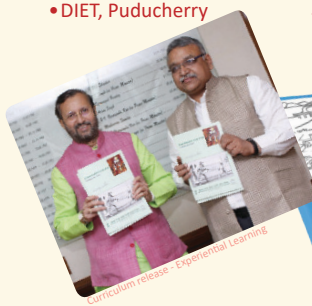
