'Education Quality Upgradation and Inclusion Programme (EQUIP)' - to Transform Higher Education in India

In keeping with the vision of Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi for finalizing a five-year vision plan for each ministry, the Department of Higher Education finalized and released, on 29th June 2019, a five-year vision plan — Education Quality Upgradation and Inclusion Programme — EQUIP, to be implemented during 2019-24. The report has been handed over to Shri Ramesh Pokhriyal, Honourable Minister, Human Resource Development, Gol. Compiled by experts including former Revenue Secretary Hasmukh Adhia, Principal Scientific Advisor K Vijay Raghavan, Niti Aayog CEO Amitabh Pant, former Infosys

CEO Kris Gopalakrishnan and Rediff.com founder Ajit Balakrishnan, apart from former vice-chancellors and educationists, the report emphasizes on 50 initiatives that would transform the higher education sector. The report stresses on strategies for making higher education more accessible, best teaching processes, promoting excellence, governance reforms, assessment, accreditation and ranking systems, promotion of research and innovation, employability and entrepreneurship, technology for better reach and internationalization, and financing higher education. EQUIP will be the similar



programme for higher education system as that of the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan for school education.

Upcoming National Conferences on Rural Engagement!

MGNCRE is organizing Three 2-day National Conferences on Rural Engagement in July 2019 at Hyderabad. These conferences are aimed at adding the much needed impetus and stature and build a body of practicing knowledge for addressing the challenges in the field of rural community engagement by universities and higher education institutions. We wish to support the participating institutions with resource material, resource persons and logistic support for incorporating these aspects in their various faculty development programmes.

Human Resource Development Centres play the critical role of being strategic apex institutions of manpower development in various Universities. Now it is recognized that the faculty members who attend various programmes in various HRDCs need to connect with local communities and villages in their neighbourhood. UGC has recently reiterated the need of Universities/Higher Education Institutions to engage with the communities.

There is an urgent need to rise above the odds and create an effective management of rural resources for an inclusive growth. Rural Engagement is a participatory approach which is based on open ended field inquiry and is action oriented. It is practical and experiential. These workshops will help in exploring and learning rural realities.

It gives me great sense of pride that we have three upcoming National Conferences on Rural Engagement in July. The conferences will engage with the faculties and other dignitarieswith respect to the importance of inclusion of Community Engagement Exercises and Participatory Learning and Action in the Orientation and Faculty Development Programmes under the ambit of UGC-HRDCs, RCIs, and Universities/HEIs across the country. As you would agree appropriate and adequate Rural Management expertise is required for rural India to move forward, as India races towards becoming the third largest economy in the world. Rural India has half the resources needed for development. Two-thirds of the Indian population is rural while 30% of the world's poor are also from rural India. Effective management of the large and heavily resourced rural development initiatives and organizations - from state, corporate or civic directions - is clearly an important key to sustained, inclusive and conflictfree growth. But so far little attention has been directed to creating the professional management competencies required for development programmes in organizations, small and medium rural initiatives, and producer-owned rural businesses - all of which require different management orientations and abilities than those of large, investor-owned, urban business enterprises. Indeed this neglect is in sharp contrast to the substantial thought, initiative and resources

MGNCRE's commitment to rural engagement is demonstrated by the upcoming three National Conferences. Rural Management education in India has produced a slim but steady and impactful stream of management professionals. It is now time for a substantial move towards the specific actions needed to develop adequate Rural Management capabilities in the country. Through these conferences, we strive to bring together institutions, academics, professionals and other key stakeholders to deliberate on strategies for expansion, standardization and improvement in Rural Management education at various levels. As part of the overall design MGNCRE proposes to promote Rural Management education at graduation level in all districts in the country by developing relevant curriculum.

Areas of focus for the conferences include -

- Expansion of Rural Management Programmess of various levels and types to meet the different kinds of demand and need, with state support as required for graduate, undergraduate, certificate, diploma and continuing education programmes.
- Development of a specialized entry process for young people with the necessary aptitude and orientation into

invested by both government and the private sector in the creation of professional managers for corporate enterprises. These conferences are expected to address the challenges in the field of Rural Engagement by Universities and Higher Education institutions.

We have an ongoing internship programme where interns from Institute of Rural Management Anand (IRMA) are the particpants and are working strenously. As part of their internship they are undergoing rigorous training programmes, conducting roundtables with eminent academicians, working on realtime Curriculum on Rural Management and participating in Rural Immersion programmes. They are also important contributors to the upcoming conferences on Rural Engagement.

I hail the landmark five-year plan for higher education -EQUIP- that aims at improving quality of education in India. The draft National Education Policy (NEP) 2019 is seriously being studied by MGNCRE as Experiential Learning elements with compulsory vocational education excite us. We have held workshops on the new NEP and wish to forward our findings, suggestions and recommendations to the Ministry as part of our contribution to education, specifically rural education.

Roundtable on Curriculum Development for BBA in Rural Management



A Roundtable on deliberations for Curriculum Development for BBA in Rural Management was held on 28th June. Participants were interns from IRMA, who are working on a vibrant set of tasks - developing a curriculum on Diploma in Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH), developing a curriculum on BBA in Rural Management, and working on Participatory Rural Appraisal and Community Engagement programmes. Dr. M Bhaskara Rao Associate Professor IBS Hyderabad, and Prof. V Venkatakrishnan Dean KIIT School of Rural Management were the expert participants along with Dr. W G Prasanna Kumar Chairman MGNCRE, Dr. K N Rekha Sr. Faculty MGNCRE and IRMA interns Tanya Sinha, Avi Jain and Arkopal Saha.

Prof Bhaskara Rao said that typical BBA caters to corporate needs. There is a need to create more development in rural sector. Currently rural sector is under manned. BBA has distinctive requirement for rural management. BBA in RM should sell as a commercial course and should have financial viability. Private universities and insurance, mutual funds, micro-finance, healthcare (Ayushman Bharat) sectors are potential recruiters of BBA graduates. There needs to be trained professionals at union and district levels apart from state levels. We should train students to be managers of rural resources. BBA should replace below average MBA courses offered. Prof Venkatakrishnan spoke on the need to sort out subjects and courses that would be feasible for BBA in Rural Management. Focus can be on local agri-commodities, and microfinance where BBA graduates can be absorbed easily. Competition is necessary. Takers of the course need to be at district level.

Chairman MGNCRE said the goal is not to create a feeder category to MBA. We should enable students to work with FPOs and Cooperatives. Curriculum suggestions included division of subjects into foundational and functional courses. Rural Credit also can be introduced as a course. Specialization has to be based on local diversity and hence an exhaustive list of electives needs to be made considering diversity.

Webinar on UBA - 4th June

Workshop - Rural Community Engagement and Rural Immersion- Participatory Learning and Action and PRA tools at HRDC University of Hyderabad, Telangana -14th & 15th June

The workshop at HRDC University of Hyderabad had 28 highly enthusiastic pan India faculty from various B.Ed colleges of Dept. of Education and its affiliated colleges. Dr. Y. Narasimhulu, Director, UGC-HRDC, University of Hyderabad inaugurated the workshop and welcomed the collaboration with MGNCRE. He urged the participants to participate actively in the workshop and come up with a community engagement exercise that will benefit the student teachers and school students of the state. The overall objective of the workshop was to engage in activities among faculties and other participants with respect to the importance of Inclusion of Community Engagement exercises and Participatory Learning & Action in the Faculty Development programme under the ambit of UGC-HRDC. Post inauguration, MGNCRE Resource Persons, Sarvani Pandey and B Prabhaker shared the background and the objectives of the programme and the two day workshop. Thereafter, a detailed presentation on Participatory Learning and Action was conducted. Here the facilitators described the Rapid rural Appraisal that was initially used as a method of appraising rural communities followed by PRA/PLA, which are fairly newer terms in the domain of research and assessment. The basic purpose of using PRA/PLA was narrated to the participants which mainly dealt with augmenting the ability of participants to conduct a proper and structured need assessment which is essential to provide viable solutions to the villages. The subsequent part of the presentation dealt with the pathway to be followed in order to conduct a PLA exercise successfully. The various tools of the exercise were explained majorly focusing on Transect

walk, social mapping, resource mapping and Venn diagram. Session three involved screening of a documentary of a model village – Hivrebajar. The participants were asked to record their observations and present them in groups of five - with each group narrating its personal observations for the success of the village. Participants were asked to take a transect walk around the campus with HRDC as centroid. The observations were recorded and depicted diagrammatically. Rural immersion was conducted at Kammeta village. With population of 2582 Kammeta is Chevella sub district's 4th most populous village.
