"Skill and Work are Inseparable from Education" was the webinar organized by IGNOU, School of Education on the occasion of National Education Day commemorating the birthday of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad. I had the honour of addressing the webinar. Recognising that the future growth of India will depend on greater skill development, the National Policy for Skill Development aims to create a skilled workforce of 500 million by 2022. This itself is a yardstick by which we can gauge the importance of skill development and to integrate it into the education system of the country. Therefore, a curriculum that values and finds a balance between both skills and knowledge needs to be the goal of education. A Conference was held online on "Social Work Curriculum under National Education Policy" where deliberations and suggestions regarding the current social work curriculum were held and the way forward discussed.

Faculty members from 12 Higher Educational Institutions shared their views on One District One Product (ODOP) in workshops for extending professional help and sharing expertise. The ODOP Institutional Level workshops with District nodal agencies through Rural Entrepreneurship Development Cells formed as part of MGNCRE's initiative to develop rural entrepreneurship are for addressing rural entrepreneurship among Higher Education Institutions and for promoting Industry-Academia interaction.

Faculty Development Program on Implementation of Case Discussion Methodology in Rural Entrepreneurship and Social Entrepreneurship was to transact any course effectively using case methods; appreciate the various aspects of Rural Management, Rural Entrepreneurship and Social Entrepreneurship, and foresee opportunities for internship, apprenticeship and entrepreneurship.

We have signed 6 MoUs. for exploring, extending and strengthening mutual relationship for promotion of professional education in Rural Management by sharing the facilities and expertise. A text book on Rural Management - Management of Cooperatives and FPOs was published. Governance and management of cooperatives and FPOs are keys to rural development and aligned growth. Success of AMUL, IFFCO, Mahagrapes, and Mulkanoor is mainly due to management structure, awareness, linkages and partnerships and overall vision of the institutions. This book is going to be helpful for all those who want to understand various aspects of cooperation, under institutional framework.

We conducted 6 Cluster Workshops on Vocational Education Pedagogy Action Plan 2021-22 for SCERT+DIETs/ University Dept. of Education and Teacher Training Colleges Task Force at Tripura University, Palamuru University, SCERT and DIETs Punjab, Kurukshetra

University, Veer Bahadur Singh Purvanchal University and Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University.

Our monthly Swachhta Activity - Score Up! Toilets on Campus – engaged over 3100 students in self-evaluation of the sanitation and hygiene status on campus (Toilets, Kitchens, canteens and campus on whole) in quantifiable terms. 1200 colleges were engaged in Campus Survey Monitoring and Auditing strategically. The Higher Educational Institutions are being oriented for Sustainability and Campus Swachhta. Self-assessment tools have been demonstrated and applied. The reports will be studied and evaluated by MGNCRE based on which the HEIs will be chosen as District Green Champions. MGNCRE had earlier awarded 400 HEIs as District Green Champions. Now, the Council is on the way to award the remaining 342 HEIs district wise (of the total of 742 districts), which will be completed phase wise by February 2022.

The primary objective for which a student joins an educational programme is to gain Knowledge, Skill, and Attitude in a given discipline. Acquiring the relevant Knowledge, appropriate Skill, and Attitude will make the student industry-ready for gainful employment. Keeping this in mind, the New Education Policy 2020 encourages educational institutions to embed skill components in their educational programmes. The Commissionerate of Collegiate Education Telangana and MGNCRE organised an Interaction about Integrating Skill in Higher Education. The Logistics Sector Skill Council presented the importance of the agri-logistics sector to the economy, and the apprenticeship-based UG Degree Programme in 'Agri-storage and Supply Chain' and briefed the participants on integration of skill in the degree programme.

MGNCRE as part of its UBA activities, conducted field visits in association with Gram Panchayat in four villages. Challenges and Issues have been identified through participatory and Community Engagement. As part of women entrepreneurship programme, Skill Training Course on Mogum Work for Rural Women in adopted villages was conducted by a UBA Participating Institute. 40 BBA Students from Sri Venkateswara Vidya Peeth Degree College and PG college, Visakhapatnam were awarded Marketing Research Internships by Cartula Health India Pvt Ltd in association with MGNCRE. This is to make the students aware about rural health needs at a grass root level and improve student knowledge and understanding of Indian health care requirements.

The vision of our Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modiji's "Skill India" and "Make in India" are laudable. This can happen only if we equip our young people with skills that are required to meet the demands of our rapidly growing economy. Given the energy, enthusiasm and innovativeness, young people of our country have the potential to contribute immensely to the socio-economic development of our nation. They should be placed at the forefront of building the economy of the country. This is a high priority agenda item for us. The interns will extend professional help and support in marketing and branding of ODOP approach in respective districts across the country. Five faculty members of each HEI are made team leaders for 1. Internship and Apprenticeship with Rural Enterprises 2. Initiating Rural Entrepreneurship 3. Networking with Rural Manufacturers 4. Developing Rural Technological Interventions 5. Grooming students to be Rural Entrepreneurs. Each Institution will be awarded an Institutional Certificate of Recognition.

Case Discussion for Rural Management and Rural/Social Entrepreneurship

Case discussion methodology is essential experiential learning methodology for training in problem solving. Case discussion methodology for promoting management education especially rural management is proposed here. The rural economy has a vast potential for development through micro, social and innovative enterprises. Higher education Institutions need to participate in contributing in the management of Rural Enterprise and encouraging Rural/Social Entrepreneurship. It needs capacity building and human resources development in the critical areas of market linkages, rural entrepreneurship, rural technology development, microfinance, livelihoods and skill development, natural resources management, management of agriculture and technical assistance in the areas of health, education, management of village sanitation and infrastructure development.

Thus, the case discussion methodology enables the participants for a multi-disciplinary approach to tap the emerging and growing opportunities in the public and private domains of rural sector. This program will dwell into specially identified rural oriented courses that cover general principles of management and the core subjects provide students with active learning, decision making and inter personal skills.

The context and the focus are rural. This program stands out for its rural engagement component- in-depth rural field exposure, duration and frequency. It has three components of field engagement and learning opportunities for students, covering a Government Organization, a NGO and a commercial rural enterprise like a co-operative or social business enterprise. Vast online repositories through university libraries and other digital media provide a unique ability for Higher Education Institutions to share success and failure case studies and experiences in ways that were unimaginable earlier.






Vocational Education Pedagogy Workshop conducted with SCERT Punjab and District Institutes for Education and Training (DIETs)



Dr. Lajo Pandey, Presiding Officer, Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University Ayodhya along with faculty members of associated and affiliated colleges of the university participated in the Vocational Education Pedagogy Workshop under the aegis of MGNCRE. The discussions revolved around "how to make students acquire livelihood skills". **Dr. Triveni Singh**, the special guest and speaker of the program, and former Principal of RR PG College, while appreciating all the programs of the Government of India, said that today the Government of India has declared Akhand Bharat, Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat, Unnat Bharat, self-reliant India, and along with MGNCRE's programs we can go a long way towards making India self-reliant.



Dr. Samar Bahadur Singh, Dean of Veer Bahadur Singh Purvanchal University, together with faculty members of associated and affiliated colleges of the University spoke about the importance of vocational education, skill development, entrepreneurship and employability in the workshop organized by MGNCRE. Dr. Singh said that now there is a need for new employment generation to make the traditional business alive, to prepare the youth of the country for entrepreneurship and employability.

Principals and Faculty members of B.Ed and Govt. Colleges of Teacher Education affiliated to Palamuru University shared interesting ways of integrating Vocational Education Methodology into the Curriculum through One District One Product flagship crops and crafts. Millets being the main crop for Mahabubnagar district, many ideas were shared during the workshop by enthusiastic and excited participants to promote their district's crop. The workshop was attended by approx. 110 Principals and Faculty from Palamuru University College of Education and Affiliated colleges.









"We are inspired by this workshop. We will integrate the beauty of local crafts and crops with teacher education and school curriculum as a part their experiential learning. We will take it up as an Abhiyan in our district duly keeping the provisions and recommendations of the NEP 2020," said participants after attending the workshop. "We learnt how to coordinate Hand Heart and Head and why we should enable students for productive work with economic value through vocational education". An overview of MGNCRE's Vocational Education Action Plan 2020-21 was presented by MGNCRE Resource Persons who facilitated interactive discussions on integration of One District One Product of various districts into Vocational Education Pedagogy Action Plan 2021-22.

"Vocational Education Pedagogy plays a critical role in skill development and employability. The importance of vocational development can largely be summed up as the difference between theoretical knowledge vs. practical skills," said honorable Vice-Chancellor of Tripura University Prof. Ganga Prasad Prasain during the online cluster workshop on Vocational Education Pedagogy Action Plan 2021-2022 organised by Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education Department of Higher Education Ministry of Education Government of India on 11th November 2021 for Tripura University and Affiliated Colleges of Education.



"Vocational education and training, allows students to gain practical experience in their chosen career path before they even graduate," said Prof. Shyamal Das, Dean, Faculty of Arts and Commerce, Tripura University.

"Just like IITs were set up for building technical skills, on Maulana Abul Kalam's birth anniversary we need to work on integrating vocational education as a pedagogical tool. A vocational activity for a student teacher at a Teacher Education Institute is one which:

a. Is undertaken continuously and consistently through the course period; b. Generates income for the students /Institute; c. Enables repetitive skill practice thereby building expertise and proficiency;

d. Helps them understand the economics and marketing aspects of the product; e. Uses local resources (One District One Crop/Craft/Product) – promotes Vocal for Local May be taken up as self-employment along with a teaching job, promoting Atmanirbhar Bharat; g. Is given due weightage in the assessment"

Dr Subhash Sarkar, HOD Education Tripura University & Coordinator of Workshop in his concluding remarks said, "Tripura University & Affiliated Colleges of Education are making the effort to implement Vocational Education and experiential learning activities and we will explore ways of adding it as a paper in the curriculum."

About 90 participants comprising Principals, Heads of Department, members of Faculty, Research Scholars of Tripura University & Affiliated Colleges of Education of Tripura shared interesting ways of integrating Vocational Education pedagogy into the B.Ed. & D. El. Ed. Curriculum through One District One Product flagship crops and crafts like bamboo, rice based products, Tea products, handicrafts, decorative items from bamboo, pickles from bamboo shoot, Handloom products, bakery products, rubber, dairy based products & multiple food processing.

"Vocational pedagogy enables us to develop models and tools which can help teachers more effectively match teaching and learning methods to the needs of their students and the contexts in which they are working," was the feedback shared by participants of the workshop.

This activity engaged over 3100 students in self-evaluation of the sanitation and hygiene status on campus (Toilets, Kitchens, canteens and campus on whole) in quantifiable terms.

78 colleges have sent in their Swachhta Action Plan assessment reports which include areas – water management, solar energy and energy







conservation, greenery management, waste management, land use management, and sanitation and hygiene.

1200 colleges were engaged in Campus Survey Monitoring and Auditing strategically. The Higher Educational Institutions are being oriented for Sustainability and Campus Swachhta. Self-assessment tools have been demonstrated and applied.

The reports will be studied and evaluated by MGNCRE based on which the HEIs will be chosen as District Green Champions. MGNCRE had earlier awarded 400 HEIs as District Green Champions, working with more than 22,000 Higher Educational Institutions involved in community engagement, Greenery, Water Conservation, Solid Waste Management, Energy Management, Sanitation and Hygiene and COVID Awareness and Preparedness, across the country.
